### **Easter Reflection:**

On being alerted by Mary Magdalene, Peter and John run to the Lord's tomb to see if the body had been stolen by someone – a hypothesis that was ruled out by what the saw there. They re-read the event in a new way, in the light of Scripture. The liturgical assembly on Easter day exults in realising all the hopes of the messianic people of God – the hope of liberation, of entering into the Promised Land, of restoration of justice, of new earth and new heavens. The faithful of Christ have entered into this new reality and live and move in its light. The real newness is Christ who came into the world, lived with humans, died and rose again and is ever present. It is Him that the interior human being is renewed every day (2 Cor 4:6). The exterior man, the old reality, needs to be broken to open up the way for the birth of the new human reality, the fruit of redemption in Christ. 'to put on Christ' is one of the many expressions coined by St. Paul to present this mysterious reality of grace. To put on Christ means to enter into Him and to live in Him so that pour life becomes hidden in Him and with Him in God. Thus 'anyone who is in Christ is a new creature' (2 Cor 5:17). The Christian is dead to sin and risen with Christ to new life.
