### THE POWER OF THE TONGUE A REFLECTION OF PSALM 91:2-3, 13-16

The power of the tongue, for good or for evil, is a thread running through todays readings. 'The test of a man is in his conversation' we read in Ecclesiasticus. 'Do not praise a man before he has spoken, since this is the test of men.' As an orchard is judged by the quality of its fruit, similarly 'a man's words betray what he feels.' The gospel develops this comparison to the fruit trees, 'For a man's words flow out from what fills his heart.'

The letter of James graphically outlines the power of the tongue for goodness or for evil. It is a flame which can set a whole forest ablaze. The same tongue which blesses the Lord may be used to curse somebody who is made in God's image.

The psalm of the day celebrates some noble uses of speech. It is good to give thanks to the Lord. And not only to God, for it is very important to express gratitude and appreciation to one another.

It is good to make music to your name, O Most High. But that same holy name is often spat out in profanity. Profanity has been called the crutch of the inarticulate.

It is with the tongue that we proclaim your love in the morning and your truth in the watches of the night.

The psalmist promises that the person of inner integrity will flourish like the palm-tree, the symbol of prayer, and persevere to old age like the mighty Cedar of Lebanon.

It is good to give thanks to the Lord.

### REFLECTION – SUNDAY 3<sup>RD</sup> MARCH 2019

A modern paraphrase of this gospel concludes: 'You don't get wormy apples off a healthy tree, nor good apples off a diseased tree. The health of the apple tells the health of the tree. You must begin with your own life-giving lives. Its who you are, not what you say and do, that counts.' It is not just for our own sake that we need to look after our health – physical, mental and spiritual. Whether we like it or not, we have an influence on others, just by the kind of people we are. Let's do our best to be fully alive so that we can be a source of life for others.

# REFLECTION – WEDNESDAY 6<sup>TH</sup> MARCH 2019 ASH WEDNESDAY

'Come back to me with all your heart' is the invitation today. This is not a call to appease an offended God. It is a call to recognize the mistaken ways we have been looking for happiness, and to change our lifestyle accordingly. God wants us to be fully alive. What changes can we make that would help us to be more physically healthy, mentally alert, emotionally at peace and spiritually alive. 'The glory of God is the human person fully alive', said St Irenaeus. May this Lent lead us to fuller living.

### REFLECTION - FRIDAY 8<sup>TH</sup> MARCH 2019

Sometimes Lent is seen as a season to multiply our religious practices and to do penance to get our personal relationship with God on track. Isaiah suggests our efforts are in vain if our relationship with people around us is lacking in care, compassion or justice. 'This is the fast that pleases me: to let the oppressed go free, to share your bread with the hungry and shelter the homeless poor.' In Lent we remember that when we open our hearts in compassion to others, we mostly closely follow the example of Jesus.
