Reflection:

Christianity is God reaching out to humanity in love; God calls us through his Son our Lord Jesus Christ to a relationship. Through Abraham (Genesis 12) God introduced himself as the one true God; the history of salvation began. However, the salvation he brought through his Son, Jesus Christ, is not exclusive to the children of Abraham. It includes the whole human family. The Apostle Peter was taught this doctrine through the conversion of Cornelius. Peter says, 'The truth I have come to realise is that God does not have favourites, but anybody of any nationality who fears and does what is right is acceptable to him.' This conviction of the universality of the salvation of Christ Jesus is the animating impetus to the missionary endeavours of the Church to reach every nationality so as to bring the message of Christ to everyone who, like Cornelius, 'fears God and does what is acceptable'. Learning to fear God and practice justice opens us and the world to the Kingdom of God—that is the most profound purpose of all inter-religious dialogue.
