# ALL THINGS ARE POSSIBLE A REFLECTION OF PSALM 137:1-5, 7-8.

This is a rare Sunday when the three readings touch the same theme: the call of God to mission. Isaiah, Paul and Simon Peter received the call of God, and each in his own way experienced personal unworthiness in the light of God's power and holiness. On seeing the huge catch of fish, Peter felt how far he was from Jesus because he was a sinful man. Paul called himself the least of the apostles, not even deserving the name of apostle. Isaiah after hearing the angels sing of God's holiness felt himself wretched, lost, a man of unclean lips.

If we rely entirely on our own resources then personal unworthiness will prevent us from doing anything. However, true humility recognises that with God's help all things are possible. It is a lesson that Paul took to heart when God assured him that our weakness serves to make more room for God's grace to work. 'My power is at best in weakness.'

The psalm of the day thanks God for help in days of trouble. *I thank you, Lord, with all my heart,* 

you have heard the words of my mouth.

The next two lines are a perfect link with Isaiah's vision of the heavenly liturgy.

Before the angels I will bless you.

I will adore before your holy temple.

One line in the last verse might well have been Peter's prayer.

You stretch out your hand and save me.

Keep our eyes fixed on Jesus and all things are possible. But focus on the storm and we start to sink.

On the day I called, you answered.

# REFLECTION - TUESDAY 12TH FEBRUARY 2019

God created everything for our good. God created man in his image and made him the crown of all creation. "How can I repay the Lord for his goodness to me?" (Psalm 116:12). As we reflect on God's goodness, viz., what God has done and is still doing for us, we cannot but see the need to be more grateful to God. Keeping God's commandments is basic in appreciating God's goodness. The Pharisees instead of keeping the commandments of so good a God, observed human traditions and wanted others to do the same. Let us appreciate God's goodness by keeping his commandments.

# REFLECTION – WEDNESDAY 13<sup>TH</sup> FEBRUARY 2019

Jesus in the Gospel gives us a spiritual principle that "nothing that goes into a man from outside can make him unclean; it is the things that come out of a man that makes him unclean" (Mark 7:15). What comes from within a man are from the heart and what one thinks. Conversion begins from thinking. Thoughts grow into words, deeds and habits, and can take over one's personality. No one should entertain evil thoughts lest they turn into action and hurt innocent people. We should daily submit our thoughts to God and ask for His sanctifying grace.

## REFLECTION – THURSDAY 14TH FEBRUARY 2019

Ss Cyril and Methodius evangelised Moravia, Bohemia and Bulgaria. St John Paul II proclaimed them Patrons of Europe. Jesus commissioned his apostles and disciples to preach the good news and they did. Paul and Barnabas preached with great missionary zeal. Christians need pastoral courage to minister to others. If we are blessed to have heard the Gospel through the efforts of other Christians, we should be willing to hand it on to the next generation. The standard for holiness and heaven remains the same for all. Direct involvement in the work of evangelisation beginning from our immediate families is urgent.

### The Passion of Jesus

On **Good Friday, 19<sup>th</sup> April**, 20,000 people will gather to watch the Easter story in Trafalgar Square. Supported by the Mayor of London, one hundred Wintershall players bring their electric and moving portrayal of the final days of Jesus to this iconic location in the capital. The 90-minute production is completely free of charge - a gift to Londoners and visitors. No tickets are required. There is a performance at 12 noon and 3:15 pm. The production is open air with visibility maximised using large screens. There is a realistic interpretation of the crucifixion so parental guidance is advised. On **Easter Saturday, 20<sup>th</sup> April**, the Wintershall cast of players and animals moves to the High Street, Guildford, in their home county of Surrey. The play begins at the Guildhall at 12 noon and again at 2:30 pm and moves down the High Street to finish outside M&S. The free 90-minute performances take place amongst shoppers in the home town of many of the cast and crew. Come and see the High Street transformed into the stage for one of the greatest stories ever told. No tickets are required. Parental guidance is advised.
