First Reading: Isaiah 40: 1-5, 9-11

We spend so much of our lives waiting for something. The wait often seems long, the necessary preparations all but impossible, the whole experience tainted by a lingering fear that something might go wrong. We hope our joy will come. We hope that we have done enough to make it happen. In the same way, we wait for God, clinging to our faith, our experience and the promise that we are not alone.

Second Reading: Titus 2: 11-14, 3: 4-7

After the coming of Christ, his followers continued to wait. Their wait was no longer for a saviour, but for eternal life with their saviour. While the preparation is just as important, the fear is gone. Saint Paul tells us that the love of Christ has been given to us, not because we earned it or deserve it, but because of his mercy. The chasm of our weakness is more than filled by his love.

Gospel Reading: Luke 3: 15-16, 21-22

John the Baptist was an enigmatic character, a man of great faith and vision who preached repentance and new life. His baptism in water, he said, was a precursor to the baptism in the Spirit that Christ would give. He laid the groundwork, set the stage. Following the baptism of Jesus, the descent of the Spirit upon him and the words from heaven, the way forward becomes clear. There is no going back. Though we don't hear of John's reaction to Christ's baptism, it must have been overwhelming to behold. His life's work and mission were coming to fulfilment in the Messiah whom he first recognised as a baby in the womb. Now the baptism he gives shares that revelation with the world.
