## BREAD FOR THE JOURNEY A REFLECTION OF PSALM 33:2-9

This is an alphabetical Psalm in which the successive verses commence with the letters of the Hebrew alphabet in sequence. God is praised, blessed and glorified, the object of boasting and the source of gladness. God has answered the psalmist's prayer for deliverance. 'I sought the Lord and he answered me; from all my errors he set me free.' This Psalm might well have expressed the sentiments of Elijah after his experience in the wilderness. 'The angel of the Lord is encamped around those who revere him to rescue them.' The angel who touched Elijah in his depressed sleep gave him water to drink and a hot scone to eat. 'Taste and see that the Lord is good. He is happy who seeks refuge in him.' And in the strength of that food, Elijah found the energy to walk for forty days and forty nights to the holy mountain where he met the Lord in the gentle breeze.

This bread for the journey which Elijah tasted was a wonderful anticipation of the bread of life that Jesus would give. As we progress with John's gospel, there is an important transition in the final verse of today's reading. Up to this point Jesus has spoken in the past tense of the bread that had come down from heaven. Now he changes to the future tense... 'the bread that I shall give is my flesh for the life of the world.' With the psalmist we praise and bless, boast of and glorify the Lord whose flesh is given for life's journey to the holy mountain. 'taste and see that the Lord is good.'

### The Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary Reflection – Wednesday 15<sup>th</sup> August

The opening verse of today's first reading begins this way: 'The Sanctuary of God in Heaven was opened and the Ark of the Covenant could be seen in it.' In the Old Testament the Ark of the Covenant was a sign of God's presence among his people. This passage is mentioned because Mary is the Ark of the New Covenant. She bore in her womb the Son of God, the Word made flesh, for nine months. When Christ goes up to take his place at the right hand of God the Father, Mary, the Ark of the New and Eternal Covenant, follows him in glory and splendour. Today's responsorial psalm confirms this further: 'On your right stands the Queen in garments of gold.' Therefore, far from being an imposition of the church, the Dogma of the Assumption of our Lady, declared in 1950 by Pope Pius XII, is part of the bedrock of the Christian faith, because it is profoundly biblical.
