# BAPTISM OF THE LORD BAPTISED UNTO MISSION

## A REFLECTION OF PSALM 103:1-2, 3-4, 24-25, 27-30.

The full celebration of the Epiphany, or manifestation of the divinity of Christ, involves the visit of the Magi, the voice of the Father at Baptism in the Jordan and the first miracle of Jesus (next Sunday's Gospel).

The psalm chosen for today is a beautiful canticle of the revelation of God's power and grandeur in creation. One of Shakespeare's characters rhapsodised about tongues in stones, books in the running brooks, sermons in stones and good in everything. To the observant soul everything is a sacred word from above.

The psalm pictures the palace of the Creator up above the rain clouds. The fluffy, white clouds that scud across the sky are the chariot of God. God walks on the wings of the wind, bearing his message afar. Fire, the gift from heaven, is his servant. All creatures of land and sea look to God for their food in due season.

The secret of creation is the breath of God. Genesis describes God saying things into life. When God sends forth his spirit or breath, things spring into life. Breath is life on loan from God. To die is to return his breath or spirit to God.

At the Baptism of Jesus, the Holy Spirit descended on him, marking the beginning of his public ministry. At his death on Calvary, his mission accomplished, his last breath is the return of life to the Father. Then on the first day of Easter the risen Lord breathed the Spirit on the disciples and inaugurated their mission. To be Baptised means sharing in that mission.

#### REFLECTION – SUNDAY 13<sup>TH</sup> JANUARY 2019

Through the Baptism scene of Jesus, the Gospel passage tells us that Jesus is anointed and presented as the Son of God. Today we are reminded of our own Baptism, the beginning of our Christian life. As Jesus began his mission as God incarnate in the world with Baptism, we too began our Christian journey by water and the Spirit. Today, his mission is our mission. The same Spirit that was with him accompanies us as we try to live the Gospel. We have made a commitment to the Catholic faith; may this feast remind us of the promise we made to live that faith with fidelity, enthusiasm and joy.

#### REFLECTION - THURSDAY 17<sup>TH</sup> JANUARY 2019

A good deed has to be spoken about; the Good News has to be proclaimed. The person cured of his leprosy did the right thing to disobey Jesus by telling everyone the good thing that happened in his life. If he was rejected and alienated by the society due to his sickness, let the same society know that he is now fit to be back there. He probably obeyed part of the demand by Jesus by showing himself to the priests; but more important was to spread the word about his cure by a person called Jesus. He thus becomes the messenger of the Good News.

## 2019 Week of Prayer for Christian Unity

Every year, Christians around the world are invited to celebrate a Week of Prayer for the unity of all Christians, to reflect on scripture together, to participate in jointly-organized ecumenical services, and to share fellowship. The international resources for the 2019 Week of Prayer for Christian Unity have been prepared by colleagues in Indonesia. The 2019 theme, 'Justice and only justice you shall pursue' (Deut 16:18-20), calls us to move from shared prayer to shared action. Drawing on the traditional values of Bhineka Tunggal Ika (Unity in Diversity) and gotong royong (living in solidarity and by collaboration), Indonesian Christians invite you to be united witnesses, and agents of Christ's healing grace in a broken world, by making specific commitments to justice, equality, and unity. The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity was first proposed in 1908 as an observance within the Roman Catholic Church by Fr Paul Wattson, founder of the Franciscan Friars of the Atonement in Graymoor, New York. Since the founding of the World Council of Churches in 1948, many other Christian denominations around the world have come to celebrate the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity.

The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity will be observed from the 18th to the 25th January – the octave of St. Peter and St. Paul.
