## A VOICE THAT SPEAKS OF PEACE – A REFLECTION OF PSALM 84:9-14

The readings feature the call of Amos and the apostles to the mission of proclaiming the word of God. Amos responded to God's call and became a scathing critic of the selfish use of wealth. Verbs of mission, like 'go' or 'send', occur more than two hundred times in the gospels. The mission of the word extends far beyond personal It is a call to take on the ethnics of responsibility for the betterment of society. In the face of the rampant individualism of today, Pope John Paul II wrote that the great challenge facing the church at the beginning of the third millennium is to be the home and school of communion. The Psalmist resolves to listen to the call of the Lord. 'I will hear what the Lord God has to say'. The message that he hears concerns working for peace... 'a voice that speaks of peace'. The task of making peace is not confined to the political leaders of the world. Civil leaders depend to a great extent on public opinion. Mercy, faithfulness, justice and peace are pictured by the Psalmist as rapt in the one embrace. Mercy moves beyond vengeance. Vengeance might achieve equal retribution but it will not resolve personal relationships. Mercy can heal the hurts. Fidelity is the foundation of trustfulness. There can be no prospect of peace without the structures of justice. When mercy, faithfulness and justice embrace, then peace has every chance of blossoming. If we 'hear what the Lord God has to say' we will work responsibly for justice and peace.
