If we take the miracle of Cana literally, we reduce it to a one-off wonder and greatly limit its meaning. It's not really about the power to change water into wine. We already know how to do that – it happens every year in our vineyards and wineries. The miracle has a deeper and broader meaning, and one that is valid for all time. It is about something far more valuable.

In attempting to describe the relationship between God and his people, the Bible uses the image of a bridegroom and his bride. And in describing the joy God finds among his people, it uses the image of the wedding feast.

Jesus brought the wine of God's love into the world. Everywhere he went the old was made new. For the couple at Cana he changed water into wine. For the widow of Nain he turned tears into joy. ## First Reading: Isaiah 62: 1-5

Isaiah's hopes for the people of Israel almost verge on the fanatic. He is convinced that God has not forgotten them, that redemption is but a day away. To a displaced and disinherited nation, these words either brought sustaining hope or seemed like a cruel taunt. This experience will no doubt be familiar to those who are displaced in our world today, waiting and wondering if they have been forgotten or if help is near at hand.

## Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 12: 4-11

The world is divided into those who have and those who have not. The division is striking, yet we are somehow numbed to it. Saint Paul offers a simple truth; the Spirit of God is given to each of us in different forms but in equal measure. We are destined to use these gifts not only for ourselves or for those that we love, but for the good of all humanity.

## Gospel Reading: John 2: 1-11

In many ways, the story of Jesus' first miracle is quite unusual. We would expect Jesus to reserve miracles for more serious cases, like illness and death, rather than show his power to save a newly-married couple some embarrassment Perhaps the reason is quite simple. Jesus revealed himself and performed this, his first miracle, because he was asked to by his mother. Mary, a woman of deep empathy, is keenly aware of the needs of this couple. She intercedes on their behalf with her Son, the Christ. Unable to deny his mother, even in this comparatively trivial situation, Jesus performs a miracle. If Jesus will not deny his mother this, he will not deny any of the prayers she brings to him.
