# A NEW SONG

## A REFLECTION OF PSALM 95:1-3, 7-10.

The fourth epiphany episode is the first miracle of Jesus, at the wedding in Cana. This event of divine revelation is celebrated as the second Mystery of Light in the Rosary. The evangelist John refers to the miracles of Jesus as signs, thereby urging the reader to move beyond the actual happening to the divine power in Jesus. John's summary is that Jesus let his glory be seen. The real wedding in the story is the marriage of heaven and earth.

Isaiah's encouragement to the returned exiles anticipated the wedding of God and his people. Just as the bride takes on a new name, that of her husband, they would no longer be mocked as a forsaken or abandoned people, but they would be called 'My Delight' and 'The Wedded'.

No wedding celebration is complete without a song. The psalm chosen for these reading calls us to *sing a new song to the Lord.* At Cana the water purification represented the old religion which was a time of preparation. This was changed into wine to celebrate the wedding.

The wedding of heaven and earth which Jesus effected is renewed every time we celebrate the Eucharist. Liturgy is always a new song to the Lord. Just as any good song is a new experience every time it is sung. It is our privilege in liturgy to join with the angels and saints in divine worship. In holy reverence we tremble before his divine kingship. It is a song that never grows old, *a new song to the Lord*.

## REFLECTION - SUNDAY 20<sup>TH</sup> JANUARY 2019

We might not be able to do something at a given moment to help another in a difficult situation; but we might know someone who can do it. Noticing the need is the starting point for any good work; doing something or getting someone to do it is the next, just as Mary did at Cana. In the second reading of today, St. Paul speaks of varieties of gifts and services entrusted by the Lord to the People. Once we realize that different people are endowed with different gifts and talents, we understand why Mother Mary could confidently tell the servants at the wedding feast, '*What ever Jesus tells you*, *do it*' (Jn2:5).

### REFLECTION - THURSDAY 24TH JANUARY 2019

In the letter to the Hebrews, the author discusses the nature of Jesus' priesthood by comparing the priesthood of Jesus and that of the priests of his time. It is not to underestimate the contemporary Aronite and Levitical priestly orders and their functions, but to focus on the totally different types of the priestly ministry of Jesus. If taking the people closer to God by being a mediator between God and the people is the duty of priest, Jesus was a priest par excellence. He did that by his service to the poor and the needy of his time and he could not set a better example of priestly ministry than this.

### REFLECTION – FRIDAY 25<sup>TH</sup> JANUARY 2019

St. Paul never minces his words in describing what he was before his conversion and what he became after. His Christian faith did not come to him from his parents, ancestors or family tradition, but, as he says, from a direct revelation he received from the Risen Jesus himself! We may not be so privileged. However, the faith is the same – the one received by Paul directly from Jesus as an adult and by many of us from a Christian family tradition. Our duty too is the same as that of Paul – to make it known to others, and being proud of it in the first place.
