Raised Up A Reflection Of Psalm 117:1-2, 16-17, 22-23

This was the last of the *Hallel* psalms which Jesus would have sung with the disciples at the end of the Passover meal. In the light of the resurrection it acquires a wonderful fulfilment. *His right hand has raised me up.* The resurrection completes the passing of Jesus from this world to the Father.

This day was made by the Lord, we rejoice and are glad.

At the great Vigil we celebrated that 'night truly blessed when heaven is wedded to earth'. Ten times the voice of the Cantor proclaimed the significance of that night when darkness was conquered. Day dawns and the women go to the tomb. Lo, the stone is rolled back and the tomb is empty! It is the dawn of a new day... a day which reaches into eternity

With the psalmist we rejoice and give thanks for his goodness which has overcome sin, and for his love which has no end. *I shall live and recount his deeds.* We are called to be witnesses to the resurrection, rising above darkness and sin. The most authentic witness is the testimony of charity in thought, attitude and action. God's love comes to perfection only when we love one another. That is how his love has no end.

May the stones of hard hearts be rolled away by the angels of God's grace. May our lives show to the world that he is risen. May the church in its holiness be *a marvel in our eyes*.

REFLECTION - SUNDAY 21st APRIL 2019

Two facts stand out which provide a sound basis for an act of faith on the story of the Resurrection: firstly, the sudden and profound transformation of the of the apostles from a bunch of cowards, huddles together in the Upper Room in deadly fear of authorities. They are flabbergasted, and their lives shattered. After the Resurrection they boldly challenge and defy the whole Sanhedrin in a religious debate, at the risk of losing their lives. And indeed, later on many of them lost their lives – becoming martyrs for the Risen Lord. Secondly, the constancy of the apostles' testimony through thick and thin, their radical transformation and the constancy of their testimony impelled them to declare again and again, "Jesus has risen from the dead." We are also called to be witnesses – through words and deeds – to people who do not know Christ.

REFLECTION - THURSDAY 25TH APRIL 2019

The resurrection was not simply an event that took place beyond history but happened in space and time, was real, and witnessed by the disciples who saw the risen Lord. The hands and feet that Jesus showed his disciples are visible today in each of us who claim to be his disciples. These are to be shown to the world as "proof" not only of the fact that Jesus is alive, but that in his name forgiveness is even now being preached. It is significant that the content of the preaching, even after the resurrection of Jesus, is to be forgiveness, because that is why Jesus came into the world, to save people from their sins. This forgiveness can be preached and made real only if we bear witness to it through our lives.

REFLECTION - FRIDAY 26TH APRIL 2019

Sometimes, it is the words of a stranger that result in the transformation of a situation. To hear these words, it is important to be as open and receptive as the disciples were though they did not know who that stranger was. If the disciples, instead of listening to what the stranger was saying, had acted arrogantly and with pride, they would never have made the miraculous catch and may never have encountered Jesus.

The Apostleship of the Sea (AoS) provides practical and pastoral care to all seafarers, regardless of nationality, belief or race. AoS port chaplains and volunteer ship visitors' welcome seafarers, offer welfare services and advice, practical help, care and friendship. The Apostleship of the Sea in Great Britain is part of an international network known to the maritime world as Stella Maris, working in more than 250 ports around the world. 90% of world trade is transported by ship. However, the life of a modern seafarer can be dangerous and lonely. They may spend up to a year at a time away from home, separated from their family and loved ones and often working in harsh conditions. So, The Apostleship of the Sea provides important support to these seafarers, and relies wholly on voluntary contributions. If you have an association with the world of seafarers or the navy, this may particularly appeal to you. It will not be a very time-consuming role.
