### RESTFUL WATERS – A REFLECTION OF PSALM 22

The choice of the popular shepherd-psalm is most appropriate on a Sunday when the readings speak of God's compassion for a straying people under the image of the shepherd leading and pasturing his flock. 'He took pity on them because they were like sheep without a shepherd.' Let us concentrate on one aspect of the shepherd's service. 'Near restful waters he leads me, to *revive my drooping spirit.* In the land of the Bible, sheep pastured on the rocky mountainsides, allowing the more fertile valleys for growing crops and vines. In contrast to other animals, sheep require very little water. Any water on the mountainside is cascading rapidly downhill. Sheep find it very difficult to drink from flowing water, so the shepherd has to make a pool of still water for them. The flowing water is an image of our racing time. Although we believe that God is everywhere, we find it difficult to drink of God's presence when the pace of life is too hectic. We need the pool of still time to revive our drooping spirits and flagging faith. It was a lesson Jesus gave to the apostles. After a period of action he called them to come apart to a quiet place, where they could be by themselves. There is no mention of any lectures for them... just quietness, rest and time to be by themselves. Unless we periodically come apart we run the risk of being torn apart. 'Near restful waters he leads me, to revive my drooping spirit."

### **Data Protection Regulation**

The new European Data Protection law, the General Data Protection Regulation ("GDPR"), was introduced on 25 May 2018. This new law applies to any organisation, including our parish that manages and processes people's personal information. We are now working on ways of ensuring that what we do with your information is compliant with this new legislation. It is a work in progress and over the next few months we will keep you informed through the parish website and in the newsletter as policies are put in place. If you have any questions about this please do not hesitate to contact the parish secretary.

### **Mass Intentions**

Mass intentions envelopes are available in the church entrance. When requesting a Mass, please clearly indicate the intention and whether the Mass is for the deceased, the sick or for another intention. Masses can sometimes be booked several weeks in advance so if you have a particular date or time on which you want the Mass, it is very important that you let the parish office know well ahead of time. We cannot guarantee a requested date when submitting Mass Intentions. If no date is specified or a date requested is not available, the Mass Intention will be assigned to the next open date. If you require confirmation of a Mass time and date, please ensure you provide your contact details.
