Therefore, my final day with responsibility for St Agatha's parish will be the last Sunday in August (27th August).

I would like to take the opportunity of thanking the parishioners of this parish for the care and support given to me over the last fourteen years, and to ask you to offer the same support and care to the priests who will accompany you on your individual journeys and the great task entrusted to them and to our community of making the "Kingdom" a reality here in Kingston.
