#### **REFLECTIONS**

Prayer forms the subject of the First Reading and the Gospel. Prayer is a favourite theme of Luke. In the First Reading we see Abraham interceding with God on behalf of Sodom, a city full of evil. Troubled by the idea of the innocent being punished along with the guilty, he begins to bargain with God. The story highlights the importance of intercessory prayer, and reveals a lot about the mercy of God.

This prepares us for the Gospel which shows Jesus at prayer and contains the Lord's Prayer. Luke's version is shorter than Matthew's, which is believed to be closer to the original version. Jesus urges the disciples to go on asking for what they need with persistence and confidence.

Jesus urges us to ask, seek, and knock.

This means our faith has to be an active one.

However, sometimes we are too proud to ask, so we don't receive;

we are too lazy to seek, so we don't find;

and we are too timid to knock, so the door doesn't open to us.

We mustn't wait for things to happen, or to fall into our hands.

We must be humble and trustful, yet bold and energetic.

If we are to receive good things from our Father in Heaven.

### First Reading: Genesis 18: 20-32

The betrayal of trust and hospitality of the people of Sodom and Gomorrah leads to a threat of divine punishment which is mitigated through the intercession of Abraham and God's willingness to spare the penitent.

# Second Reading: Colossians 2: 12-14

The joy of forgiveness and the new life and power given through baptism is explained by Paul as a consequence of the sacrifice willingly given by Jesus on the cross.

# Gospel Reading: Luke 11: 1-13

The pattern of all prayer is given by Jesus as he teaches his disciples to pray for the essentials and also to persevere in prayer in the sure hope that God listens and responds.
