REFLECTION Encircling prayer

In today's second reading we hear St Paul say:

'Let your armour be the Lord.'

First Reading: Isaiah 2: 1-5

The prophet Isaiah paints a picture of the culmination of God's plan for his Chosen People and for the world. The temple in Jerusalem will be the gathering place, not only for Israel, but for all nations. The wisdom and law of the Lord will bring all peoples together and his justice will prevail. There will be an end to war and the establishment of peace and justice. This vision is given to encourage us to 'walk in the light of the Lord'.

Second Reading: Romans 13: 11-14

St Paul exhorts the Romans to behave worthily as they live in a privileged time – Christ has inaugurated the next stage of God's plan, so his followers are to live with their minds and hearts set on that plan's fulfilment. In practical terms, this means setting aside the deeds we would prefer to be obscured and living in the light. Our lives should be of transparent integrity.

Gospel Reading: Matthew 24: 37-44

Christ calls for alertness and attention from his followers. He tells us how the people in Noah's time were so caught up in their own concerns that they failed to read the signs that were given to them. It should not be so for followers of Christ who have been instructed in what is to come. Christ calls for vigilance rather than worry! His word is faithful and he has prepared us.

As his followers, we are called to be discerning about the present moment by reference to what he taught us during his First Coming and with our eyes set, in faith and hope, on what he means to accomplish by his coming in glory.
