My dear brothers and sisters, at last I am able to give you some firm information regarding the future clergy who will be taking responsibility for the pastoral care of this wonderful parish of Saint Agatha.

I am pleased to inform you that Father Julius Otoaye MSP will be moving into the presbytery of St Agatha's on Monday 28th August. But before that date you may see Father Julius about as he will be moving his possessions into the presbytery so that Father Henry Tiku-Wenna can move into the presbytery at Saint Pius X, Norbiton. At a later date, yet to be announced, Father Julius will be joined by another MSP priest here at Saint Agatha's.

As for me, in accordance with Canon Law, as I am in my 75th year of age, the Archbishop has agreed to my retirement from being attached full time to a parish. He has also agreed that I will continue to live in the area and has asked that I make myself available to supply and help in the parishes of this deanery and in the diocese in general as and when he feels it necessary. Therefore, my final day with responsibility for St Agatha's parish will be the last Sunday in August (27th August).

I would like to take the opportunity of thanking the parishioners of this parish for the care and support given to me over the last fourteen years, and to ask you to offer the same support and care to the priests who will accompany you on your individual journeys and the great task entrusted to them and to our community of making the "Kingdom" a reality here in Kingston.
