DISCERNMENT

A REFLECTION OF PSALM 18:8, 10, 12-14

Today's psalm raises some very pertinent questions in the area of discernment:

- How can I detect all my errors?
- What are my hidden faults? Perhaps others can see them but I can't?
- Does presumption rule me? I have met selfappointed prophets presuming divine inspirations behind their messages for me. But am I also guilty

of presuming that my opinion is of God's direction? The issue of discernment arises in today's first reading and gospel. Moses and Jesus decide that if good is being done then that matter is of God's direction. By their fruits you shall know them. The writer of psalm 18 seeks his guidance from God's revelation, first in the grandeur of creation and then in what is called the law. The heavens proclaim the glory of God and the firmament shows forth the work of his hands. The law of the Lord is an all-embracing term for the covenanted relationship of God and his people, including their beliefs, moral code and directions for cultic celebrations. The law of the Lord is perfect... revives the soul... gives wisdom to the simple... gladdens the heart... gives light to the eyes. Counselling can help me to sort out the layers of my experiences to enable me to see where I am and what I need to do. The task of spiritual direction is to see where God is involved in all this. The rule of the Lord is to be trusted; it gives wisdom to the simple.

Reflection – Tuesday 2nd October 2018

As we celebrate the memory of the Guardian Angels, the readings of today remind us of the presence of angels in our lives and invite us to concentrate on our responsibility of protecting ourselves and others. The responsibility of guarding primarily emerges from the fact that God has protected his people and has assured that He would continue to protect us and would never leave us orphans. The responsibility of guarding comes also from the exhortation of God to be the keeper of one's brother or sister (Gen 4:9). Today, the first message given us is to trust in God, the Divine Protector. Secondly, we must remind ourselves of the different ways of God's protection that we have experienced. Thirdly, we ought to guard ourselves from occasions that lead to sin and consequent spiritual death. Finally, we have the duty to guard and protect everyone from dangers, sins and death.

Reflection – Thursday 4th October 2018

The beginning of every mission can be traced back to a human misery. Today Jesus presents us the misery of the people who have not received the message of salvation and the misery of the lack of workers who can proclaim that message of salvation. After presenting the problem, Jesus also proposes a solution: pray for more vocations to reach the word of God everywhere; prayer reveals that it is not human merit but gratuitous gift of God that results in Christian vocations. The life of the disciples of Jesus will be characterised by a sense of urgency to preach the kingdom, willingness to accept 'crosses', willing dispositions to renounce the worldly attachments, singlemindedness and dedication to the God-given mandate and the courage to warn with dire consequence those who reject God's message.

St Agatha's Ladies Group


