The Gospel is a continuation of last Sunday's reading. We see the reaction to the homily Jesus gave in the synagogue at Nazareth. The people can't believe that the words of Isaiah could apply to him, the humble son of Joseph. On hearing that the benefits they have rejected will be offered to the Gentiles, the people rise up in fury and attempt to do away with Jesus. This foreshadows the ultimate fate of Jesus; but his hour has not yet come.

St Paul has been speaking of gifts and charisms. But here in the Second Reading he stresses the supreme importance of love. Without love all these gifts are useless.

# CAFOD Lent Fast Day

This year, CAFOD's Lent Fast Day once again reminds us of the need for potable water throughout the world. We all hopefully appreciate the immediate benefits of a readily accessible source of drinking water. But for some, the presence of such water in their community has a hidden impact, in that women and children are released from the daily chore of fetching water in. So women and children, especially young girls, are free to pursue more fulfilling activities. For young girls like 14 year old Proscovia (featured in this year's campaign) it means that her education can be continued. A recent press release from the charity Why Water suggests that in Africa alone Women spent 40 billion hours a year walking for water. The figure may not be CAFOD's but the message is the same. Clean water improves lives: reduces disease: allows children to have a childhood and survive that childhood and have an education: allows women a more rewarding time with their family, and yes set up that market garden – not for them the delights of day-time TV. "Treat the earth well. It is not inherited from your parents, it is borrowed from your children." CAFOD thank you for your continued support.

# First Reading: Jeremiah 1: 4-5, 17-19

# Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 12: 31 - 13: 13

In our modern world, the word love is used loosely to describe how we feel about everything: I love to sing, to dance. These things make **me** feel happy. But if I love in the true sense of the word, I am only interested in how those I love feel, not in me. This is such a perfect reading for our Holy Year of Mercy, for love is mercy. It is forgiveness and compassion. It is the bond that binds us together.

# Gospel Reading: Luke 4:21-30

Jesus' mission was a challenging one and that gives us all hope. There are times for all of us when being a follower of Jesus can be difficult – on a personal level. There are times when spreading the Good News or bearing witness to our Christian faith, within and beyond our own communities, can prove very testing. It is comforting to remember that there are so many who have gone before us. So many, who like Jesus in the face of adversity, 'walked through the middle of the crowd' and went on their way. Filled with the courage of the Holy Spirit we too may find the courage to be undeterred in our mission.
